Instructions for the 2-Page Abstract

Paper Format: A4 portrait orientation.

Margins: Top 5 cm, Bottom 45 cm, Left 45 cm, and Right 45 cm. Single line spacing throughout.

Header and Footer: 44 cm. Paragraph spacing before and after: 0 points.

Title: Centered, Times New Roman, 12 points, bold, followed by an 18-point blank line, Times New Roman.

Authors' Names: Centered, Times New Roman, 10 points, bold, separated by commas, followed by a 10-point blank line, Times New Roman.

Postal Addresses and Emails: Centered, Times New Roman, 8 points, followed by an 8-point blank line, Times New Roman between each address.

Blank Line: 18 points, Times New Roman before the text begins.

Body Text: Times New Roman, 9 points, justified.

The abstract must not contain chapters or subchapters but must include at least one figure referenced as follows (fig. 1) and optionally a table referenced as follows (tab. 1).

The figure/table caption is in Times New Roman, 9 points, italic. Figures/tables and their captions are centered.

Spacing between Text and Figures/Tables: 9 points, Times New Roman.

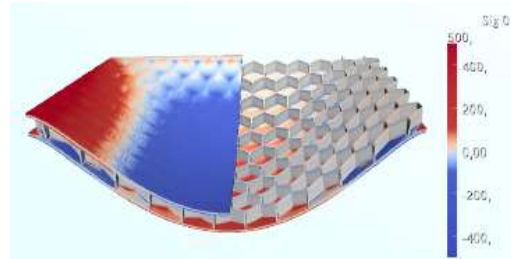


Figure 2. Example of Figure

Equations: Centered and identified as follows: (eq. n) in the text.

$$\vec{F} = m\vec{a} \quad (\text{eq. 1})$$

The abstract must not exceed two pages and must include a mandatory list of bibliographic references, even brief, and referenced [1] in the text.

Do not modify the header and footer areas.

Abstract files - in .pdf, .doc, or .docx format - should be directly submitted on the ICEA25 website under the submission section (<http://!!!!>).

The size of the .doc abstract file should not exceed !!!!

Acknowledgments

An "Acknowledgments" section can be inserted before the references, which can be useful, for example, to present a research program associated with the manuscript and the partners of this program.
